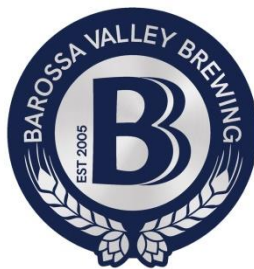

## A1 Captain's Report

This year the Tanunda A1 cricket team welcomed a handy cricket player and good bloke in Coby Cornish, we started the year off very well not losing before Christmas is always a plus. The boys got to experience a T20 under lights against Angaston and the way we played I could not be any prouder of them. We had a win, and it always feels good beating Angaston. Another handy in we had into the cricket team this season was having Luke "Chenny" Snowden playing full time. I have always said he can probably be the best all-rounder in the competition on his day; his bowling smarts are up there with the best. Poor Chen though, he bowls too well and can't catch the edges that he deserves. Mitch Boschen also took his bowling up another level, great to see him crack 20 A1 wickets this season, looking forward to a couple of great years ahead for Mitch.

After Christmas we started really well with a solid win over Sandy Creek, then travelling up the road to Nuri in a one dayer and posting 188 in 40 overs. Some would say we were 20/30 short of par at Nuri oval and then they came out and were 1/60 off 5 overs, we had to really dig in and see what we were made of. This is the day I knew the boys had grown a lot over the last couple years as we been in those positions before dropped our head and then been smashed, but we dug deep and ended bowling them out for 180 with some leg spin class from my boy Sammy Q Colquhoun. Bailey Smith who I believe has a lot of potential in both footy in cricket dropped a catch in the deep when Nuri were close to the target. We threw everything at Nuri after that, verbal insults, good hard cricket. But they got across the line 9 down and carried on batting to have a 50 run lead. ## A3 Captain's Report

Coming off a worldwide pandemic, the year was always going to present challenges, but from an A3's perspective the biggest challenges alongside scoring with an iPad included the removal of 'Tea' supplied by the home team and communal cordial container.

The season was off to a great start beating eventual grand finalists Kapunda in round 1. There was an enthusiastic feeling around the A3's side given the added depth of the A grade side which would filter through to the A3's and we all felt could play deep into finals. Early season wins against Nuriootpa (twice) and Angaston set-up the A3's for a finals berth and potential top 2 finish. Close losses to Sandy Creek (Round 11) and Light Pass (Round 12) put us back into the mid-table logjam before player availability due to vintage workloads and injuries to key players resulted in understrength sides going down in the final 2 matches.

We had 4 different captains across 10 games and multiple changes every week which contributed to our lack of batting consistency. Given we only had one batsman average well over 20 for the season, the ability to dig in and bat for long period of time along with fielding will be a focus for the upcoming season.

Some notable mentions for the season included:

- Blake Dahlitz's 6 fa 14 against Nuriootpa in round 3 where he looked unplayable at stages during his 11 overs.
- Chris Gattermayr's 135 not out also against Nuriootpa where he single handedly carried the side to an important win. Chris terrorized the opposition with some big sixes and didn't hold back when the younger opposition bowlers came onto bowl.
- While being 4 for 118 chasing 160 and losing to eventual premiers Lyndoch was not a great result, all players agreed that it was just about the toughest conditions we had all played in. Constant winds which did not settle made standing up straight difficult and it was just about impossible for any players to talk when 15-20m away. The bails were removed due to halting play about 5 times an over for the first few overs of the day. Was a great effort from our bowlers, particularly Lachie Miller and Toby Talbot coming up the hill and into the wind to bowl with consistency for long spells.
- Come back from behind team wins against Nuriootpa and Angaston mid-season.
- Pete Mernagh's 89 off 66 balls including some massive sixes in his standalone performance against Light Pass. Also taking the ball when voted in by his peers despite not being able to walk showed the character of the man.
- Dan Kroehn playing at missing at 3-4 balls in a row before hitting a big six in most games he played. Dan was also a great contributor when it came to sledging.
- The development of some young players coming through the junior ranks including Harry Robinson, Ben Swann, James Kraft, Emma Hartigan, Kalan Hoklas and Lewis Bulla. We encourage you all to play on next season.

Big thanks to Chris Goers and Pete Edwards for preparing quality pitches throughout the season which both our opposition and us were fortunate to play on. Also, to Ratschy and Chopper for all the work you do behind the scenes, but the biggest thanks go to Stuart Swann. It is unbelievable how much time and effort you and your entire family put into the club and it is scary to think where we would be without you. Thanks mate.
